Some children may think...

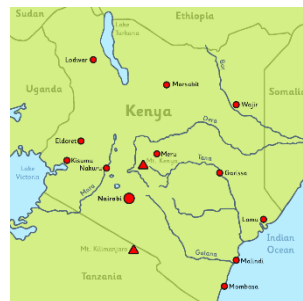
- That Africa is part of Europe
